Darlot's Creek in Flood.

Old residents on the banks of the Darlot's Creek state that the recent heavy rains have brought the level of that stream to the highest point recorded for the past forty years. For close on a month, waters from the Condah Swamp (which was recently like an inland lake) and Wallaceedale have swept down the outlet drain constructed as part of the Condah Swamp drainage scheme. One correspondent states that there should be good eel fishing a little later on in the back waters of the creek below the old Ettrick homestead.
